RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS

Some of you will know that Val (our Churchwarden) and I like running. Well, that might be a bit of an overstatement. Val likes running and does it a lot, whereas I just shamble round the Park run in Clare Country Park most Saturday mornings (when it's not too muddy or

cold). It takes my mind off my busyness in the week, the problems I face in my work and stops me dwelling on some of the distressing stories I hear as I go through my week. The apostle Paul had it right when he talks about 'running with perseverance'. It's no good throwing in the towel part way round a park run course, or part way through dealing with a problem, you have to see it through to the end. But, like the parkrun where there are lots of people, he knows that when we are running our race of life we are not alone. Paul writes:-

'Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us' Hebrews 12:1

Each generation that has gone before us has welcomed new life, enjoyed abundance, experienced joy and yet has also known grief, endured hardship and at times felt immense sorrow. Being human invariably means that we will all experience these things (and more) in our lifetime. We enjoy the good times but when more challenging seasons roll in, we can become despondent and perhaps fail to see the possibilities in a new dawn. Yet, this

passage invites us to remember that great cloud of witnesses - ordinary people throughout history that the Lord has worked in and through to do extraordinary things — and not only to dare to dream of a brighter future, filled with possibility and hope, but to be people that the Lord will use today to make those dreams and visions a reality



here and now. We just need to shake off all that holds us back from seeing and believing and then step forward at pace into the future that the Lord has prepared for us.

I am certainly not naïve about the challenges that we face this year, both as individuals and as church, and yet these words from the letter to the Hebrews is surely just the encouragement that we need in such a time as this. So, whatever is going on in your life right now, hear the Lord whispering these words to you and with faith, prayer and a good sense of humour let's run together with perseverance the race marked out for us as God's family here in the Stambourne, and look forward to how the Lord will bless us - and others through us - in the months and years to come.

FROM THE CHAPEL

Our last book sale (in January) made a profit of £110 which will go toward the Chapel funds. Our thanks to all those who came along and enjoyed a cuppa and a cake! Our thanks to helpers and bakers too!

Our work now heads toward Easter and looking toward the Lent preparations which remembers three things all in one event. Firstly it is the build-up to the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt and represents the 40 years they spent in the wilderness as God guided their wanderings – something that He still does today as we are all apt to go wandering! Isaiah 53:6 says "For we, like sheep, have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way;" And through this Lent period we remember the 40 days that the people spent preparing for that exodus, eating only unleavened bread. We also remember that Jesus fasted 40 days in the wilderness at the start of His ministry before being tempted. After 40 days without food I think I would have turned stones into bread, but not Jesus. It is also the 40 days when we prepare for Easter, which is all about the other thing that Isaiah said .."and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all." That is Jesus has taken away the guilt we feel for wandering away our own way.. Jesus gave His life on the cross for each of us as a sacrifice for our wanderings from the ways of God.

Sponsored Slim - And so through Lent we will be "fasting", or at least slimming – if you would like to slim we will meet on Tuesday to weigh in and will have forms for sponsorship. We start on Pancake day - 1st March.

Cycle Ride - After Easter we will be cycling round Notley Park and you can join us and get sponsored to do the number of 2 mile laps you think you can achieve — so you have February to get the wheels turning on your bicycle again! The date will be in the April Newsletter!


