23/1 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

23/2 MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY 2022

The minutes of the Annual Parish Assembly 2022 were approved as a correct record and signed.

23/3 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY 2022

23/4 CHAIR'S REPORT

The chair's report was read out at the meeting and accepted. A copy was attached to these minutes.

23/5 VILLAGE HALL REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT – MRS YOUNG

It was noted that Mrs Young had been unable to attend the last meeting of the Village Hall Committee due to attending a funeral. She understood that the accounts should now be available.

23/6 EMERGENCY PLANNING REPORT – MR CRAGO

Mr Crago advised he had a copy of the Emergency Plan. It was noted the plan was up to date.

23/7 PUBLIC TRANSPORT REPORT – MR DRYSDALE

Mr Drysdale not present.

23/8 FOOTPATHS REPORT – MRS GRANT

It was noted that footpaths were kept under review.

23/9 PLANNING REPORT

Nothing to report.

Cllr Schwier arrived at the meeting.

23/10 BDC REPORT – CLLR VAN DULKEN

Cllr Van Dulken reported. It was noted that the Conservatives had been re-elected but with reduced majority. Wetherfield Day Care Centre - An appeal against the decision had been submitted alongside an appeal from a resident. An appeal had also been made by the District Council at RAF Scampton. Assurances had been made that no one will be moved onto the site until 23 June.

There were no questions and Cllr Van Dulken was thanked for his report.

22/11 ECC REPORT - Cllr SCHWIER

Cllr Schvier's annual report had been circulated in March. Points noted were:-

- Wetherfield day care centre - ECC were also involved with supporting the District Council and the latest position was noted.
- Locality Grant - Confirmed as £5,000 to be shared across the Hedingham division.
- Potholes - An underspend in part of ECC's budget of approximately £9 million together with an additional grant from national government of approximately £7 million will be used across Eborac to address potholes. Some of this money has already been used to engage people directly rather than using Ringway Jacobs and 6 additional crews were already out working. Councillors were reminded that potholes could be reported using the "What3Words" app as well as online.
- Streetlighting - The Council had achieved the target of replacing 100,000 streetlights with LEDs.

There were no questions and Cllr Schvier was thanked for his report.

23/12 GENERAL DISCUSSION

No items tabled.
