STAMBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL

The last meeting of 2025 took place on Thursday 20 November 2025 at 7.30pm in the village hall. We were pleased to welcome our District Councillor, Richard Van Dulken and County Councillor Peter Schwier and members of the public. In his report, Cllr Van Dulken referred the Parish Council to the consultation on the proposed Local Government Reform. Pavilion – The pavilion has now been closed for the winter. It has been well used throughout the spring and summer and will be available again in the spring. If you would like to book the pavilion, please contact me (details at the bottom of this report).

Playing Field – The parish council have applied for grant funding from the Community Initiative Fund to buy a new piece of play equipment. We will keep you up to date with progress.

Planning – Application number 25/02346/COUPA - Unit 2, Greenfields Farm, Great Yeldham Road, Stambourne, Essex CO9 4ND – Members of the public

attended the meeting and made a statement about this proposal. After listening to the statement and considering the proposal, the parish council raised objections to it which have now been submitted.

Bleed Kits – As reported previously, the parish council have purchased two bleed kits which will be located at the village hall and chapel. These have now been delivered and will be fitted as soon as possible.

Church Road Telephone Box Book Swap – The lovely person who kindly set up and ran this has now stopped and the telephone box has been cleared. Unfortunately, this was because, despite notices in place, it was not kept tidy and books were left on the floor, making them damp. It was also being used to dump unwanted items which were not appropriate for use. *

Budget 2026/27 - At this meeting the parish council has to decide what its budgets will be for the next financial year. Figures were discussed and agreed in principle and will be reviewed again at the January meeting.

BONFIRE NIGHT

Once again this was a resounding success with large numbers of people attending to enjoy the fireworks, bonfire, food and drink. The weather was kind and the new arrangements for overflow parking worked extremely well with thanks to the landowners for kindly allowing us use of this land. As I have said before, it would not be possible to put on an event of this kind without the large number of volunteers who step forward every year. There are teams of people managing the bonfire, fireworks, teas, sweets, carparking, first aid and barbecue. Thank you also to Splinters for the loan of their barbecue. These people gave up their time to organise, set up, run and then clear up afterwards to raise money for their village. Thank you every one of you. Thank you to everyone in the village for your patience with the influx of traffic into the village. Some of the money raised from last year has been used to buy the bleed kits which are going to be installed at the Chapel and Village Hall, next to the defibrillators and some will be used to buy a new piece of play equipment with the help of an application for grant funding from the CIF Fund.
